After a 71 year run in Yakima, the **Pacific Northwest Tournament** will be held this year at Eastgate Park in Kennewick, WA. It will be the same weekend as usual, Sept. 16 and 17, and there will be a warm-up tournament on Friday, the 15th.

Ed Ludwig - 1st World - Just arriving." I am excited, nervous, anxious, and scared. I will have a good time."

Natalie Clark - Spectator. I have been to 10 world tournaments with family. I am a spectator, cheerleader, just there to support our pitchers. I like to observe the different pitching styles. I recognize people from previous world tournaments and reacquaint myself with and catch up with how things have been going. I also like to see the different designs on the shirts from the different states. I recommend any non-pitching family member to go with the pitcher and cheer them on. Win or lose it matters that you are there.

Ron Heutick - 2nd World - The first was in Gillette Wy. We were in tents. We are here and we drove down and no tents. Brought the grandkids this trip. It is a learning curve to have them with us. 


