The race for 2014 Tournament Pitcher of the Year begins on April 12th at the Tulip Open in Burlington. This competition was first proposed in 1999 by WSHPA Hall of Fame pitcher, Bob Clark of Port Orchard. It rewards those pitchers who not only pitch well, but also those who participate in a number of tournaments. At the State Singles banquet the champion is named and the top point getters receive monetary awards. Another objective of this competition is to help keep our Tournament participation up all across Washington State. Here's how you accumulate points:

- * If you compete in a tournament 5 pts
 - * For each Win you receive 5 pts
 - * For each Tie you receive 3 pts
 - * For each Loss you receive 1 pt
 - * For each out of state tmnt one time award 8 pts

Dear Horseshoe friends,

I talked with Rick Rebman again this morning concerning Pat's condition. The news is not good. She is back in the hospital. Her spleen is enlarged (three times normal) and is gobbling up everything the bone marrow produces. It needs to be taken out, but she is not strong enough to withstand it right now. Chemo, radiation and steroids are among the things that have been tried. A liver test was conducted earlier this AM and, if it is also involved, there is little or no hope. It will take a couple of days to get the results but, even if it is negative, her situation is still guarded at best.

I will be talking with Rick again on Saturday and I will pass along any more pertinent information that I get.

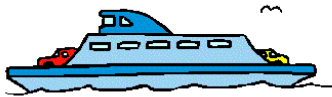

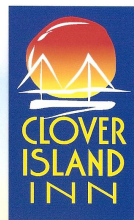

Entries received with a postmark after May 15th shall be put on a waiting list and entered into the tournament only as space is available. NATSTATS/CANSTATS files must substantiate that you have pitched a minimum of four (4) sanctioned events in the preceding twelve (12) months, at your divisions pitching distance, prior to May 15th 2014. Only one (1) event is required for Juniors and Cadets. Participants will be required to show their 2014 NHPA or CANADIAN membership card when checking in to pitch.

REGISTRATION FEES: ALL ADULTS -- \$125.00 • ALL JUNIORS -- \$25.00 • U.S. FUNDS ONLY
CANADIAN ENTRIES USE MONEY ORDERS REGISTRATION FEE INCLUDES SCORE KEEPING FEES

NO REFUNDS AFTER May 23rd 2014.

You may enter at anytime prior to May 15th. All adult averages used will be the average on record in NATSTATS/CANSTATS on May 15th. Entry fees received before April 1st will be held until that date.

READ CAREFULLY: Any adult male pitching from the full distance platform may enter the **OPEN MEN'S DIVISION** regardless of age, just as any adult female may enter the **OPEN WOMEN'S DIVISION**. To enter the **SENIOR DIVISION**, you must be 60 years of age or older before the end of 2014. Any man that turns 70 years of age in 2014 or is older or physically impaired person of any age may enter the **ELDER MEN'S DIVISION**, provided they meet the requirements listed above. **JUNIOR DIVISION** entrants must be 18 years old or less for the entire 2014 calendar year.

Note # 1. A Social Security number is required from all adult pitchers that move up to the Championship Classes.

Note # 2. For class play a minimum of 48 must enter this division or it will be canceled. All entrants will then pitch with the Open Women.

Note # 3. Junior Cadets must be 12 years old or younger for the entire 2014 calendar year.

THE 1964 WORLD TOURNAMENT WAS ONE FOR THE AGES!

I've been re-reading the book The Official N.H.P.A. History of the World Tournament 1909 -1980, by Gary T. Kline, and found some great performances in this 1964 tournament. Three of our Washington pitchers were in this championship class, including John Monasmith as Defending Champion.

- ◆ Thirteen pitchers were above 80% ringers for 35 games! (These were all 50 point games.)
- ◆ Floyd Toole pitched 62 straight ringers!
- ◆ Our Henry Knauff was still pitching 90% after 28 games! After 35 games he was still averaging over 80%!
- ◆ The Martin-Maddox game went 176 shoes!
- ◆ The top 13 pitchers all averaged above 80%!
- ◆ The top 31 were above 70%!

It's amazing to realize just how great these pitchers were when compared with the 2013 World tournament results: Championship Men and Elders, combined, had two pitchers above 80% and a total of five above 70%!

Congratulations to these pitchers of yesteryear. We can strive to match them - you can do it !


