3<sup>rd</sup> VP – Bob Sperber – Met with Lawn Bowling members and they pitched a few shoes. Maybe we can get some new members.

Regional Director – Vic Magnus – New schedule has been published with updates.

Secretary/Treasurer – Rhonda Davis – We continue to have duplicate entries in eshoe for renewals. Please use “join” for new members and “renew” for renewals. See Rhonda if you have any questions or cannot find your name for a renewal.

### Committee Reports:

Junior Promotions – Bonnie Lewis- Nothing at this time

Statistician – Vacant office- Vic would like to see this position filled. We should put together a list of duties that we think this person would be responsible for then look for a candidate.

Promotions – Frank Easterly – Not in attendance

Hall of Fame Committee – Phyllis Quist, Hall of Fame Chairmen Bonnie Lewis has been added as the newest member to the Hall of Fame Committee.

Memorandum of the President – Don Davis

I appreciate the people who have stepped forward to help with the unforeseen holes that make the state horseshoe organization run smoothly.

Unfinished business

- Cindy will put together a spreadsheet for those available to help at the world tournament. Contact her with when you will be there and when you pitch. This will also be mentioned in the Shoes News.

- Try to wear white or green, our state colors, to the world tournament to show we are from Washington.
- Statistician office. Include topic in next executive board.

#### New business

- Only division champions (Men, Women, Elder) would get a jacket for State Singles. – No decision was made – table until next executive board
- Schedule for state singles is published in the WSHPA schedule. Looking at Olive Garden for the state banquet. Executive board will be Saturday morning, time TBD.
- Bellingham will no longer hold tournaments due to parks department issues. They will keep their club active for now.
- World items – Phyllis mentioned that you should add on extra days to really experience the world tournament and help where you can. We will need help with setup and take down, judging, scorekeeping, Washington state booth and raffle, Hall of Fame trailer, practice courts in Kennewick, information booth and check-in. Don did mention that we as a horseshoe organization were not informed prior to accepting the bid. Bonnie to contact all juniors and give names of those who plan to attend the world tournament to Ben Webb.
- We need a replacement for Vic in the regional director position.
- Team world 2024. We would like to have the state pay for the entry fee of \$200 and scorekeeping fees TBD – Approved by the board.
- New member packet to be created. Rhonda and Cindy will work on this and present it when it is ready.
- Addi Knudsen requested a scholarship. Approved a \$250 scholarship to be paid to the school of her choice.
- Create clear junior participation guidelines in order to receive a scholarship and add them to the bylaws – table until next executive board.
- Pitch state singles another weekend other than Labor Day – keep it as is for this year and see how it goes – table until next executive board since we are only pitching two days and not on Monday.
- Pay scorekeepers \$1.00 per game and have scorekeepers paid by the tournament director. – Keep as is, no action needed.
- Vic suggested we increase the state dues from \$20 to \$40 in order to keep our organization running. – address at next executive board.

Meeting adjourned at 10:00 am

A different page will come up, "Become an NHPA member". Type your name and personal information in the boxes. At the bottom of the page under "Charter" select Washington (if they reside in Washington State); under "Division" select the appropriate division; and under "Membership Type" select full.

Your payment information will come up, select payment method and pay.

Select RENEW (blue button) that comes up on the home page.

I wonder if our membership numbers have anything to do with the way we look at our “hero’s” and how much we care about the people and history that formed our sport. Do we really take pride in belonging to this organization or is it just something for us to do on a Saturday?
